St. Michael's Celebrates Marriage Equality

Like many others I waited with great anticipation to hear the Supreme Court's decisions regarding Proposition 8 and the Defense of Marriage Act. Like many others I practically leapt with joy when these two laws were declared unconstitutional. The Episcopal Church, through its General Convention, and the Diocese of Los Angeles, to quote Bishop Bruno, has "long affirmed that marriage equality indeed means marriage equality for all".

We here at St. Michael's have always taken our baptismal covenant seriously. We mean it when we say that we will seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbors as ourselves. And that we will strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being. Two of the ways we have tangibly tried to live and declare these values have been through our Resolution on Marriage—which resolved that clergy of this parish would not sign marriage certificates for any couple until marriage was legal for all couples—and the Repeal Prop 8 banner which has hung on the front of our building since that unjust law was passed. It gives me great joy to declare that we can now set both of these aside.

On Wednesday, June 26th, I sent a message to the Executive Committee suggesting three ways our parish family will celebrate. First, we are developing a new banner which will replace our old banner. As soon as the new banner is ready we will plan a Saturday morning event where we will remove the Repeal Prop 8 banner. In its place we will display a banner that reads "We celebrate marriage equality." After the changing of the banners the congregation will be invited to our newly completed Meditation Garden where we will celebrate the Eucharist for the first time in that space. In addition, we will also use this opportunity to bless and dedicate the garden.

Finally, with the Executive Committee, I will be drafting a new Resolution on Marriage which

will declare that the clergy of St. Michael's will once again sign marriage certificates and weddings will resume in our parish. Because there are occasions where priests are invited to officiate at weddings in other states, the resolution will also state that the clergy of this parish will not sign marriage certificates in states where same-sex marriage is not legal. This new resolution will be presented to the Vestry at our July meeting.



I am looking forward

to our upcoming celebration and will provide you with more information regarding dates and times as soon I am able. Let us rejoice in the words that St. Paul once wrote to the Galatian church, "With Christ there is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male or female; for all of you are one in Christ Jesus." I am certain Paul would have included—in Christ there is also no longer straight or gay—because we are all one in the family of God, equally beloved in Christ.

Dream Big with Imagine LA

It's an exciting time for our Outreach ministry—there are many volunteer opportunities throughout the summer from Soldier Care to 2nd Sunday Sack Lunches to the Prayer Shawl Ministry. You can donate a few minutes during coffee hour or make a promise to serve with one of our many programs over the next year or two. One of our newest opportunities is to work with Imagine LA.

Imagine LA supports families that are transitioning out of homelessness by matching them with faith partners (like St. Michael's) and building a team of support. Imagine LA was established in 2006 by the Rev. Dr. Mark Brewer from Bel Air Presbyterian who saw a connection between the number of homeless families and the number of faith communities in Los Angeles. He thought that if each faith organization could partner with just one family, we might have a chance at ending homelessness. Since 2007, the program has grown to include 29 faith communities and has served 53 local families.

St. Michael's will be partnering with Imagine LA to work with a North Hollywood family of a mother and her son. We are recruiting a team of volunteers to work with this family over the two year program length. The team is comprised of 2 co-leaders, 1 budget mentor, 1 Mom's mentor and 1 historian. We are still in need of one more co-leader and the Mom's mentor. The co-leaders speak with the family a few times per month to check in about upcoming needs and challenges. The Mom's mentor provides a kind ear for support, career advice and friendship. Imagine LA's staff will support the family as well as our team with case managers and important resources. In addition, over the course of the program, we'd like to host cooking nights or movie nights to invite the family to meet the greater parish community. Let us know if you are interested in planning one of these with us.

Anyone who is interested, even if you are not sure if you can commit, is invited to attend the training sessions about the program and homeless sensitivity. Upcoming sessions are Monday, July 22nd, from 6:30–9:00 pm, Saturday, August 24th, from 10:00am–12:30 pm, and Monday, September 23rd, from 6:30–9:00 pm. Training is held on the Miracle Mile at 5455 Wilshire Boulevard, Suite 1001, Los Angeles, CA 90036.

St. Michael’s Men’s Group

Since the “re-boot” of the St. Michael’s Men’s Group last October, I have been getting a number of questions about the group. Here are some of the questions that are often asked:

“Is this just one big Bible study group for the men of the Parish?”

Not really. The Men’s Group is a once-a-month gathering of the men of the parish to engage in candid conversation about life, faith, family, spirit, and soul, to name just a few items of discussion. Though we often center each meeting around scripture, sometimes our discussions involve current moral, ethical, political, and socio-economic issues. For example, this past June our central discussion topic was about St. Michael’s being a place where we cultivate a deep life of faith which gives life to service in the world. This led to a discussion on how and in what ways our faith has grown and how that growth has led us to service by participating in volunteer work and other charitable efforts.

“What else do you all do besides meet and talk about stuff?”

The Men’s Group has been quite active in a number of Parish related activities ranging from assisting with the maintenance of the building and grounds, as well as lending a hand at off-site events. In fact, this past June was a busy month for the Men’s Group.

The month started off as a team lead, by Peter Juzwiak, who was on hand to help with the pool party at Betsy Hailey’s home, helping to set up, manage the food and beverage offerings and staying to help with clean up. June ended with the big parish picnic at Beeman Park, where our “grill team” was on hand to oversee the BBQ duties and assist with set up and clean up.

“When do you meet?”

We meet once a month. In “even” numbered months, we meet on the third Saturday at 8am, in the Ministry Center. These meetings begin with a hot breakfast. On “odd” numbered months we meet on the third Wednesday at 7:99 pm. This meeting is at someone’s home and is usually a pot luck affair. July’s meeting will be on July 17th at the home of Chris Flick.

“Can I bring my son to a meeting?”

As long as he is 21 years or older. This is a Men’s Group and we do speak openly about a number of adult related topics, which is one of the main reasons this group has been so successful over the years.
